REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 17 BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING MINUTES

December 6, 2011

A meeting of the Regional School District 17 Board of education was held on December 6, 2011 in the Central Office Board Room. Superintendent Howard Thiery called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Call to Order/Opening of Meeting

Superintendent Howard Thiery called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Audience of Citizens

Mark Lundgren thanked the new board members for their willingness to serve. He pledged his help on issues near and dear to his heart, such as Transportation. He indicated he reviewed the Boards 5-year Strategic Plan and he has no idea how the Board will implement it. He suggested the Board create a Listening Subcommittee to hear what town residents like him have to say.

Jason Brown addressed the Board regarding class dues, which he said were briefly mentioned in senior orientation. Mr. Brown indicated he sent a couple of emails to Mr. Thiery about this issue. Mr. Brown spoke with Charlie Macunas who said the dues were voluntary but when the \$55.00 bill came it indicated a \$5.00 late charge if not paid by the due date. He stated that paying the bill did not appear voluntary. He questioned why it was not stated in the orientation material that dues are voluntary, and if they are voluntary, why is a late charge incurred. Mr. Brown questioned why senior dues would go toward a gift to the school or the senior class as opposed to being used to offset senior class activities as they should.

Superintendent Thiery responded that indeed senior dues are voluntary. Mr. Thiery explained that he met with Mr. Macunas on this issue and Mr. Macunas met with advisors and explained how the letter needed to be written going forward. The voluntary information will be included in orientation materials in the future. Mr. Thiery assured Mr. Brown that students may pay as they go. Mr. Thiery also stated that high school seniors decide if they want to use some of their class dues money to buy a gift for students or a gift for the district and any gift is strictly the choice of the senior class.

Board Committee Reports

A. Report from Student Representatives – Erin Buckley reported on the Co-Curricular Fair which took place on November 9th, each club was represented at a table. The play My Fair Lady played on November 11th and 12th there was a great turn out. On November 30th during advisory period students attended a one hour presentation on "Rachel's Challenge" which motivates them to positive change in the way they treat others. Rachel Scott was the first person killed at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. A huge poster hangs in the high school and students sign and accept Rachel's Challenge. Erin noted that already she has seen a notable change in how students treat each other.

Emily reported student council has started a chain of paper links, each link represents a kind word or thought about others. We are hanging the chain in the hallways at the high school and hope to have it reach every hallway.

Emily noted the Chorus Concert to be held next week included both Middle School and High School students and together they raised over \$2500 for charity.

- Football made it to the quarter finals for the first time since 1994.
- B. Facilities and Transportation *Did not meet, no report.*
- C. Building Subcommittee (new school) *Did not meet. The state approved the project closure however how to spend the remaining 600K is still to be decided.*
- D. Building Subcommittee (solar/alternative energies) Erin reported that she and Peter Brandon attended a task force meeting to look at energy conservation district wide, this has been done in a district in West Hartford. Any savings could be used in curriculum and conservation district wide provides hands on experience for students. Consent from the schools would be required and the students would make the presentations on the results.
- E. Education Subcommittee *No report*.
- F. Communications Subcommittee Susan Dean reported the committee is discussing better ways to communicate with the public using public access channels and setting up forums.
- G. Finance Subcommittee Jonathan noted at the last meeting refinancing the debt was discussed. Martha indicated that due to current fluctuations in interest rates she would get current rate figures and the committee could look at it again.
- H. Policy Subcommittee Susan noted the committee is working on the 5000 Series, they meet next week on Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. The 5000 Series is a student series and includes expulsions and bullying. In addition, the committee will be working on a new Bullying Policy mandated by the State.
- *I.* Personnel Subcommittee *Did not meet, no report.*
- *J.* Audit Subcommittee *Did not meet, no report. Merged with Finance.*
- K. Healthy Communities Healthy Kids Council rep. Susan Dean reported research from Search Institute identifies 40 Developmental Assets that have a powerful, positive impact on young people. About 59 percent of young people, ages 12–18 years, have 20 or fewer Developmental Assets, according to Search Institute Surveys. The good news is we can change this because we all have the power to build assets in young people's lives. More on this can be found on our website on the Youth and Family Services tab, under Resources.
- L. LEARN representative No report. Our LEARN rep is no longer on the Board. A new rep will be needed to keep the Board informed on what our RESC is offering.
- M. Park & Recreation representative *Keith Kelsey reported that Park & Recreation will meet tomorrow*.
- N. Haddam Board of Selectmen liaison Steven Banaletti reported the BOS discussed the Constellation Energy contract recently approved by the BOE.
- O. Killingworth Board of Selectmen liaison Susan Dean reported the Killingworth BOE met on November 28th. It was noted they really appreciate the update that Howard prepares for them each month.

New Business

- A. Board of Education Committees- The current BOE committees were reviewed giving new board members an opportunity to learn the purpose for each and the meeting schedule.
 - Facilities and Transportation oversees long term projects and transportation reports as needed. Currently meets monthly but may go to a quarterly schedule.
 - ➤ <u>Building Committee</u> (Solar Energy) is not a BOE committee but is made up of district faculty and students and meets in Mrs. Ferrer's class. The board decided a member of the Facilities Committee would serve as liaison on this committee.
 - Education meeting is made up of all Board members and is one of the two meetings held by the Board per month. The meeting is held at the Middle School in the Lower Media Center on the 3rd Tuesday of each month.
 - ➤ <u>Communications</u> The BOE communicates to the community through this committee. Susan would like to see us have a stronger relationship with our state legislators. This committee meets once per month.

- Finance and Audit The Board discussed and decided to merge these two committees into one. This committee meets once per month on the 1st Tuesday of the month prior to the regular BOE meeting.
- ➤ <u>Policy</u> This committee has a big job and requires an intense commitment. The committee meets once each month and is currently working on the 5000 Series. The Policy Series begins at 0000 and ends at 9000, all are undergoing revision except the 0000, 9000 & 4000 Series, which were recently completed. This committee meets in the Superintendent's office.
- Personnel meets as needed when issues arise and during negotiations and/or contract issues. No contract renewals are due for the next two years. Howard recommended eliminating a standing personnel committee and convening the committee when needed, all agreed.
- ➤ <u>Healthy Community Healthy Kids Council</u>, Susan Dean stated, is a part of Youth and Family Services, they meet once per month. A Board member serves as liaison.
- ➤ <u>LEARN</u> LEARN is our RESC, located in Old Lyme. LEARN is made up of representatives from each district in the RESC. The LEARN representative brings information to LEARN and from LEARN to the BOE.
- ▶ Park & Recreation Parks and Recreation is the single largest user of our facilities.
- ➤ <u>Haddam Board of Selectman</u> They meet twice a month. Howard creates an update on district events and the liaison shares it with the BOS.
- ➤ Killingworth Board of Selectman Same as above.

From the Superintendent

- A. <u>December Education Subcommittee Celebrations</u> Last month celebrations were instituted at the Education Sub-Committee meeting of the Board. This month we will celebrate two high school students who were awarded the CAPSS (Connecticut Association of Public Schools Superintendents) Award. The HKMS was named a Unified School because of its Unified Sports Program. The HKHS was named to the Advanced Placement Honor Roll on AP exams by the College Board.
- B. <u>CAPSS Educational Transformation Project</u> Howard explained that CAPSS is a professional organization for superintendents. The Education Transformation Project presented by CAPSS includes 134 recommendations, with both a new Commissioner of Education and a new Governor, CAPSS felt they needed to get their agenda in place now for consideration. Howard has a full report electronically and would be happy to share it with any board member interested. Lastly, Howard reported that he met with local superintendents and state representative Jim Crawford last week to exchange ideas, they plan to meet again in January.
- C. <u>Enrollment Report</u>- The report was reviewed, Karen Perry suggested having the class sizes on the right total the average class size at the bottom. Howard will make the change.
- D. <u>Personnel</u>- The board is not required to act on this, although it has been voted on traditionally in the past even though the action has already occurred. Keith Kelsey suggested for the next meeting this item be brought under the consent agenda in the future and appear as a report.
